Awa / Hae



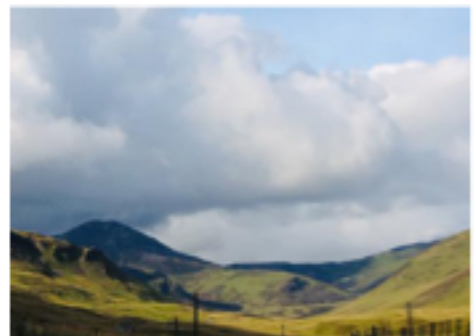
Activity 2

Dae – do / **Yon** – those /

Ower – over / **Wi** – with

Sna – snow / **Hae** – have

Pairted – parted / **Mony** - many

Twa – two / **Busk** – hurry

Bonnie – pretty / **Awa** – away

Tak – take / **Doon** - down

Plaidies – a thick blanket or shawl

Aroon – around / **Sojers** – soldiers
